All the base words need changes before the suffixes can be added

Words ending in –e

like (ing) ride (er)
tame (est) bone (y)
bake (ed) hike (ing)
fine (est) wave (ed)
rule (er) rude (est)

Words ending in –y

marry (ed) funny (er)
worry (ed) copy (er)
hurry (ed) messy (est)
lucky (er) ferry (s)
carry (ed) pony (s)

words ending in a single consonant

stop (ing) mad (er)
skip (ed) run(ing)
hop (er) nod (ed)
pad (ing) hid (en)
hot (est) rip (ed)

Examples for practicing adding the suffixes

– ing –ed –ful –ly –est –er –ment –ness –en

Some of the base words need changes before the suffixes are added but some do not

Remember: a final **e** in the base word may or may not need to be dropped

spite (ful) rude (ly) white (er) bite (ing)
lame (ness) safe (ly) amuse (ment) rise (ing)
time (ed) use (ful)

Remember: a final **y** in the base word may or may not need to be changed to **i**

merry (ly) empty (ment) play (ed)
enjoy (ment) silly (ness) funny (est) obey (ing)
sunny (er) happy (ly) stay (ed)

Remember: a final consonant in the base word may or may not need to be doubled (if the vowel is short)

bad (ly) flap (ed) send (ing) slim (ed) fan (ed)
sad (ness) put (ing) flat (en) bat (ing) dark (est)
