We are starting to see a few positive cases within our classes and families. From next week we shall be informing parents if there is one in your child's class. It is recommended that your child if they are in this class gets a PCR. If we reach 5 cases or more in key stage unit, UKS2, LKS2, KS1 or EY or 3 in once class, then we will have to go onto the next step in our contingency plan. This is now version 3 which is on the school website. This would reintroduce face coverings for staff around school, reverting back to the one-way system for example at pick up times with face masks, limiting mixing indoors etc.

WALKERS TERRACYCLE

We are now collecting empty crisp packets at lunchtime that will then be packaged up and sent to a local collection point. Mrs Whittingham, a school governor, and the school council will help with this – thank you. Once collected by the company, the crisp packets are separated by plastic type, cleaned, and extruded into plastic pellets to make new recycled products.

We hope your children get involved with their empty crisp packets and make a difference with recycling.

We also recycle ink cartridges, batteries and outgrown school shoes in school.
